Graduate teaching assistants who want to become teachers will develop their teaching skills so they are ready to be enrolled on a teacher training course.  Kief and Maria	<p>In September 2018, one teaching assistant will take up the position as Post Graduate Teacher Apprentice. She will share a class with a member of MLT who will also act as a mentor.</p> <p>Others TAs will continue delivering PPA cover for 1 or 2 sessions per week. They will also receive regular mentoring from members of the leadership team to improve their skills. This will be reviewed in December 2018 by which time further Apprentice Posts can be advertised.</p> <p>September 2018, graduate TAs will be encourage to enrol on the Preparing to Teach course delivered by the PDSS service. This programme will last for the whole year and will be compulsory for all Post Graduate Teacher Apprentices. Training should include understanding of EHCPs so that all prospective teacher understand the code of practice and are able to adapt teaching to pupil needs.</p> <p>Through out the year TAs preparing to teach will embark on lesson studies lead by the Assistant HT. She will draw up a timetable of observations, starting in Autumn 2018, in conjunction with the MLT team.</p> <p>From Autumn 1, KH and ML will produce guidance and case studies on recording effective progress on Behaviour Watch. This will include written annotations/summaries of pupil progress. They will also provide training on recording through Behaviour Watch. Throughout the year KH and ML will also collect examples of meaningful daily assessment found in pupil folders. They will also provide folders with examples of medium term plans highlighting the students' outcomes and age appropriate resources</p>	<p>Trainee teachers will becoming more confident in delivering good to outstanding lessons through high quality training and mentoring. Teaching Assistants delivering PPA cover will improve their teaching adequately to qualify them to apply for Post Graduate Apprentice Positions. All staff concerned will gain a greater knowledge of lesson delivery, planning and assessment.</p> <p>Greater consistency in the quality of teaching will mean pupils will be challenged more in lessons and will make outstanding progress. They will be able to progress in their learning aims and targets overtime. Observations and learning walks will demonstrate that students are highly engaged during lessons.</p> <p>Parents will be pleased with the progress their children make in lessons the PPA TAs' deliver. Students' progress will be effectively discussed during Annual Reviews and an outline of the curriculum topics will be sent home every term allowing the whole school community to be aware of the curriculum coverage.</p>	<p>Students' progress can be measured by Kief, Maria &amp; SLT through learning walks, observations, book scrutiny (Blue folders and Behaviour watch) or other moderations. This can take place every half term. Discussions and feedback after lesson studies session will demonstrate that prospective teachers are developing a greater understanding of what an outstanding lesson looks like.</p> <p>Pupil data and termly reports on teaching and learning.</p> <p>Parents will feedback at parents evening or other methods such as phoning, emailing or having meetings with staff.
